Knitted, woven and felted products produced locally by Kurragong Handspun Crafts, giftware and an abundance of plants for sale round out the incredible array of items available for visitors to the fair.

Discover the many horticultural delights within the 78-acre grounds on a free guided tour departing from the Visitor Centre.
